After William was Black Veil Brides and boy was the crowd screaming. They started their set off with the song "I am Bulletproof" from their new album. Poor Andy Biersack (Vocalist) was sick which made his voice a bit off but damn do I have so much respect for him for not cancelling the show and be their for his fans. I believe he did the best he could and put on a great show. One of my personal favorites were their cover of "Rebel Yell" Originally done by Billy Idol.
